#### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

Senate Bill 368 Judicial Proceedings (Senator Giannetti)

Judiciary

#### Appeals - Removal of Personal Representative - Successor Personal Representative or Special Administrator

This bill provides that an appeal from a final order of an orphans' court or circuit court removing a personal representative of an estate does not stay an order appointing a successor personal representative or special administrator. It also grants the successor personal representative the powers of a special administrator during an appeal from a final order removing a personal representative.

#### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** The bill is procedural in nature and would not directly affect governmental finances.

**Local Effect:** None – see above.

Small Business Effect: None.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** An appeal from an orphans' court or circuit court stays those proceedings that concern the issue being appealed. Appeals from final orders by a court removing a personal representative would fall under this rule. A special administrator may be appointed by a court when there is no personal representative serving, and has the power to collect, manage, and preserve property. The appointment is generally of limited duration.
