AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 131

(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, strike lines 2 and 3 in their entirety and substitute "Maryland Health Care Commission - Affordability of Health Insurance in Maryland - Study and Recommendations"; and strike in their entirety lines 4 through 12, inclusive, and substitute:

"FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Health Care Commission to conduct a certain study; requiring the Commission to develop recommendations on ways to make private health insurance more affordable for Maryland residents; requiring the Commission to submit certain reports to the General Assembly on or before certain dates; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a study and recommendations about the affordability of health insurance in Maryland."

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 1 and 2, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 15 on page 1 through line 33 on page 2, inclusive, and substitute:

- "(a) The Maryland Health Care Commission shall conduct a study of:
- (1) the number of, and the regulatory requirements relating to, health insurance carriers in Delaware, the District of Columbia, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia;
- (2) the factors that contribute to increases in health care costs in Maryland, including utilization of health care services;
- (3) the role of tax-deferred health savings accounts and other models of offering health insurance coverage designed to increase consumer awareness of the cost of health care services;

- (4) ways to educate consumers about health care issues and promote personal accountability in health care;
- (5) ways in which disease management programs can promote the appropriate management of chronic diseases;
- (6) ways to encourage strategies to purchase health care that focus on quality and patient safety;
- (7) ways to facilitate a more effective and efficient health care delivery system, including improved information technology and evidence-based medicine; and
- (8) <u>innovative programs in other states designed to encourage the appropriate use</u> <u>of health care services.</u>
- (b) Based on the study conducted under subsection (a) of this section, the Commission shall develop recommendations on ways to make private health insurance more affordable for Maryland residents.
- (c) The Commission, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, shall submit to the General Assembly the following reports on its findings and recommendations:
 - (1) an interim report on or before January 1, 2005; and
 - <u>(2)</u> <u>a final report on or before January 1, 2006.</u>".

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 2, in line 35, strike "6 months" and substitute "1 year and 7 months".

On page 3, in line 1, strike "December 31, 2004" and substitute "January 31, 2006".
