- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the State Board of Education from establishing a
- class or type of diploma or certificate for graduation from a public high school 4

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 **Article - Education**
- 16 7-205.
- 17 The promotion of students in a public school and graduation from a public (a) 18 high school shall be in accordance with:
- 19 Policies established by the county board; and (1)
- 20 The rules and regulations of the State Board. (2)
- Each student who graduates from a public high school shall receive 21 (1)
- 22 the same type of diploma or certificate, regardless of the high school attended or the
- 23 course taken.
- 24 (2)[The] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE
- 25 diploma or certificate shall state that the student has completed a program of studies
- 26 satisfactorily in accordance with the requirements of the State Board.

- 1 (3) THE STATE BOARD MAY NOT ESTABLISH A CLASS OR TYPE OF
- 2 DIPLOMA OR CERTIFICATE FOR GRADUATION FROM A PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL FOR
- $3\,$  STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES THAT IS TIED TO THE STUDENT'S PASSAGE OF THE
- 4 MARYLAND HIGH SCHOOL ASSESSMENTS OR ANY OTHER SIMILAR TESTS.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 October 1, 2004.
