BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 17 **Article - Election Law** 18 8-201. 19 (a) (1) There shall be a statewide primary election in every even-numbered 20 year. 21 A primary election shall be held: (2) 22 (i) in the year in which the Governor is elected, on the second 23 Tuesday after the first Monday in September; and
