2 Alarm Systems - Registration, Use, and Response

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the monetary penalty that a law enforcement unit or
- 4 fire department may assess for a negligent or accidental alarm activation or
- false alarm; authorizing a county to require that an alarm user register an
- 6 alarm system; prohibiting a county from charging an alarm system registration
- fee; authorizing a county to impose a fine or civil penalty if an alarm user fails
- 8 to register an alarm system; prohibiting a law enforcement unit or fire
- 9 department from not responding to a signal because an alarm system is
- unregistered; and generally relating to the registration and use of alarm

- 27 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 28 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - Criminal Law 2 9-607. 3 (a) In this part the following words have the meanings indicated. 4 "Alarm system" means a burglary alarm system, robbery alarm system, or (b) 5 automatic fire alarm system. "Alarm system contractor" means a person who installs, maintains, 6 (c) 7 monitors, alters, or services alarm systems. "Alarm system contractor" does not include a person who only 8 (2)9 manufactures or sells alarm systems. 10 (d) "Alarm user" means: 11 a person in control of an alarm system within, on, or around any (1) 12 building, structure, facility, or site; or 13 the owner or lessee of an alarm system. (2)14 "False alarm" means a request for immediate assistance from a law (e) (1) enforcement unit or fire department regardless of cause that is not in response to an 16 actual emergency situation or threatened suggested criminal activity. 17 (2)"False alarm" includes: 18 (i) a negligently or accidentally activated signal; 19 (ii) a signal that is activated as the result of faulty, malfunctioning, 20 or improperly installed or maintained equipment; and 21 a signal that is purposely activated in a nonemergency (iii) 22 situation. "False alarm" does not include: 23 (3) a signal activated by unusually severe weather conditions or 24 (i) 25 other causes beyond the control of the alarm user or alarm system contractor; or a signal activated within 60 days after a new installation of an 26 (ii) 27 alarm system. 28 "Law enforcement unit" means the Department of State Police, the police 29 department of a county or municipal corporation, and a sheriff's department or other governmental law enforcement unit having employees authorized to make arrests.

"Signal" means the activation of an alarm system that requests a response
