18 19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 THAT AUTHORIZES THE LICENSED PHARMACIST TO DISPENSE EMERGENCY 2 CONTRACEPTION TO EITHER: 3 (I) PATIENTS OF THE LICENSED PHYSICIAN; OR (II)INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE NOT PATIENTS OF THE LICENSED 5 PHYSICIAN. "EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION" MEANS A METHOD OF (3) (I) 7 PREVENTING PREGNANCY. "EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION" DOES NOT INCLUDE 8 (II)9 ABORTIFACIENTS. "LICENSED PHYSICIAN" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LICENSED TO 11 PRACTICE MEDICINE UNDER TITLE 14 OF THIS ARTICLE. 12 IF A LICENSED PHARMACIST HAS AN ARRANGEMENT THAT HAS BEEN 13 APPROVED BY THE BOARD AND THE STATE BOARD OF PHYSICIANS, THE PHARMACIST 14 MAY DISPENSE EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION. AN ARRANGEMENT: 15 (C) MAY BE INITIATED BY EITHER A LICENSED PHARMACIST OR A (1) 17 LICENSED PHYSICIAN: AND SHALL BE VALID FOR 2 YEARS FROM THE DATE OF ITS FINAL 19 APPROVAL BY THE BOARD AND THE STATE BOARD OF PHYSICIANS UNLESS 20 RENEWED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ESTABLISHED REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER 21 SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION. 22 THIS SECTION DOES NOT SUPERSEDE THE PROVISIONS OF § 5-902 OF THE (D) 23 CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE. SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE BOARD AND 24 25 THE STATE BOARD OF PHYSICIANS SHALL JOINTLY DEVELOP AND ADOPT 26 REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION. - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the regulations required by this Act shall be adopted within 6 months of the effective date of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 4 effect October 1, 2004.
