BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 19 **Article - Education** 20 7-115. TO FACILITATE THE TRANSFER OF SCHOOL-AGED STUDENT DEPENDENTS 21 (A) 22 OF MILITARY PERSONNEL TO AND FROM THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF THIS STATE, THE

- 1 STATE BOARD SHALL PURSUE RECIPROCITY AGREEMENTS WITH OTHER STATES
- 2 REGARDING THE TERMS OF THOSE STUDENT TRANSFERS.
- 3 (B) A RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT SHALL INCLUDE PROCEDURES FOR:
- 4 (1) THE TIMELY TRANSFER OF STUDENT RECORDS;
- 5 (2) AWARDING CREDIT FOR COMPLETED COURSE WORK;
- 6 (3) ALLOWING A STUDENT TO SATISFY THE GRADUATION
- 7 REQUIREMENTS OF § 7-205 OF THIS TITLE THROUGH SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF
- 8 COMPARABLE COURSES IN ANOTHER STATE; AND
- 9 (4) ALLOWING A STUDENT TO SATISFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE
- 10 MARYLAND HIGH SCHOOL ASSESSMENTS THROUGH SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCE ON
- 11 COMPARABLE EXIT-LEVEL OR HIGH STANDARD ASSESSMENTS ADMINISTERED IN
- 12 ANOTHER STATE.
- 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1,
- 14 2005, the State Board of Education shall report to the Senate Budget and Taxation
- 15 Committee, the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee, the
- 16 House Appropriations Committee, and the House Ways and Means Committee, in
- 17 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the results of its efforts
- 18 to enter into the reciprocity agreements. For each state with which the State Board
- 19 did not enter into a reciprocity agreement, the report shall include:
- 20 (1) a detailed description of the State Board's efforts to reach an
- 21 agreement; and
- 22 (2) an explanation of each factor contributing to the failure to reach an
- 23 agreement.
- 24 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 25 July 1, 2004.
