2 Maryland Transportation Authority - Transportation Facilities Projects -

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Transportation Authority to provide 5 certain information to certain committees of the General Assembly in a certain 6 manner and by a certain time prior to fixing or revising tolls on any 7 transportation facilities project; prohibiting the Authority from establishing and 8 fixing tolls on any new transportation facilities project without the approval of 9 the Board of Public Works; and generally relating to toll charges authorized by 10 the Maryland Transportation Authority.					
11 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, 12 Article - Transportation 13 Section 4-101(a) and (i) 14 Annotated Code of Maryland 15 (2001 Replacement Volume and 2003 Supplement)					
16 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 17 Article - Transportation 18 Section 4-312 19 Annotated Code of Maryland 20 (2001 Replacement Volume and 2003 Supplement)					

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Transportation** 2 4-101. 3 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated. 4 (i) "Transportation facilities project" includes: 5 The Susquehanna River Bridge, the Harry W. Nice Memorial 6 Potomac River Bridge, the William Preston Lane, Jr. Memorial Chesapeake Bay Bridge and parallel Chesapeake Bay Bridge, the Baltimore Harbor Tunnel, the 8 Francis Scott Key Bridge, and the John F. Kennedy Memorial Highway, together with 9 their appurtenant causeways, approaches, interchanges, entrance plazas, toll 10 stations, and service facilities; 11 A vehicle parking facility located in a priority funding area as defined 12 in § 5-7B-02 of the State Finance and Procurement Article; 13 Any other project for transportation facilities that the Authority (3) 14 authorizes to be acquired or constructed; and Any additions, improvements, or enlargements to any of these 15 16 projects, whenever authorized. 17 4-312. 18 (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 20 of Section 3 and § 16 of 19 Section 4 of Chapter 608 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1976, tolls may be 20 continued to be charged on the John F. Kennedy Expressway and any project 21 constructed under the provisions of § 3 (bridge, tunnel, and motorway revenue bonds) 22 of Chapter 608 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1976. 23 As to all or any part of any transportation facilities project, the 24 Authority may: 25 Fix, revise, charge, and collect rentals, rates, fees, tolls, and (i) 26 other charges and revenues for its use or for its services; and 27 (ii) Contract with any person who desires its use for any purpose 28 and fix the terms, conditions, rentals, rates, fees, tolls, or other charges or revenues 29 for this use. 30 (b) The rentals, rates, fees, tolls, and other charges and revenues designated 31 as security for any bonds issued under this subtitle shall be fixed and adjusted from 32 time to time, either with respect to a particular transportation facilities project or in 33 respect of the aggregate of the charges and revenues from other transportation 34 facilities projects under the control of the Authority, as may be specified by law or in 35 any applicable resolution or trust agreement, so as to provide funds that, together 36 with any other available revenues, are sufficient as long as the bonds are outstanding 37 and unpaid to:
