Criminal Law - Motion Picture Theaters - Prohibition against Audiovisual Recording

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from knowingly operating an audiovisual

5 recording function of a device in a motion picture theater without the consent of

6 certain persons under certain circumstances; providing immunity from civil

7 liability to a certain owner, lessee, agent, or employee who detains or causes the

8 arrest of a certain person under certain circumstances; making the provisions of

9 this Act severable; and generally relating to audiovisual recording in motion

10 picture theaters.

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

9 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

11 5-402.

(A) A merchant or an agent or employee of the merchant who detains or causes
the arrest of any person shall not be held civilly liable for detention, slander,
malicious prosecution, false imprisonment, or false arrest of the person detained or
arrested, whether the detention or arrest takes place by the merchant or by his agent
or employee, if in detaining or in causing the arrest of the person, the merchant or the
agent or employee of the merchant had, at the time of the detention or arrest,
probable cause to believe that the person committed the crime of "theft," as prohibited
by § 7-104 of the Criminal Law Article, of property of the merchant from the premises
of the merchant.

(B) AN OWNER OR LESSEE OF A MOTION PICTURE THEATER OR AN AGENT OR
EMPLOYEE OF THE OWNER OR LESSEE WHO DETAINS OR CAUSES THE ARREST OF
ANY PERSON MAY NOT BE HELD CIVILLY LIABLE FOR DETENTION, DEFAMATION,
MALICIOUS PROSECUTION, FALSE IMPRISONMENT, OR FALSE ARREST OF THE
PERSON DETAINED OR ARRESTED, IF IN DETAINING OR CAUSING THE ARREST OF
THE PERSON, THE OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, OR EMPLOYEE HAD, AT THE TIME OF THE
DETENTION OR ARREST, PROBABLE CAUSE TO BELIEVE THAT THE PERSON
COMMITTED IN THE MOTION PICTURE THEATER A VIOLATION OF § 7-308(E) OF THE
CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.

32 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

33 (2) "Deliver" means to sell, rent, distribute, or circulate.

34 (3) "Performance" includes a live performance and a performance that is35 transmitted by wire, radio, or television.

36 (4) "Recorded article" means a phonograph record, disc, wire, tape, film,
37 videocassette, or other article on which sounds are recorded or otherwise stored.

1 This subsection applies only to sound recordings initially fixed before (b) (1)2 February 15, 1972. 3 (2)Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person may not 4 knowingly transfer or cause to be transferred any sounds recorded on a recorded 5 article to any other recorded article: with the intent to sell or cause to be sold for profit or used to 6 (i) promote the sale of any product; and 7 8 without the consent of the owner of the original fixation of (ii) 9 sounds embodied in the master recorded article. 10 (c) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person may not knowingly 11 deliver, offer for delivery, possess for delivery, cause to be delivered, cause to be 12 offered for delivery, or cause to be possessed for delivery a recorded article or device: 13 on which sounds have been transferred without the consent of the (1)14 owner of the original fixation of sounds embodied in the master recorded article; or 15 (2)embodying a performance without the consent of the performer. 16 (d) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person may not (1)knowingly transfer to or cause to be transferred to a recorded article on which sounds 17 18 or images have been transferred or stored any performance: 19 (i) with the intent to sell or cause to be sold for profit or used to 20 promote the sale of any product; and 21 (ii) without the consent of the performer. 22 A person may not knowingly deliver, offer for delivery, or possess for (2)23 the purpose of delivery a recorded article on which sounds or images have been 24 transferred or stored, unless the recorded article bears in a prominent place on its outside face or package: 25 the actual name and street address of the transferor of the 26 (i) 27 sounds or images; and 28 the actual name of the performer or group. (ii) 29 EXCEPT IN THE LOBBY AREA OF A MOTION PICTURE THEATER, A PERSON (E) 30 MAY NOT KNOWINGLY OPERATE AN AUDIOVISUAL RECORDING FUNCTION OF A 31 DEVICE IN A MOTION PICTURE THEATER WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF: 32 THE OWNER OR LESSEE OF THE THEATER; AND (1)33 (2)THE LICENSOR OF THE MOTION PICTURE BEING EXHIBITED.

34 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this 35 Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any

- reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other
 provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the
- 3 invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are
- 4 declared severable.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 6 October 1, 2004.
