- 3 (A) A merchant or an agent or employee of the merchant who detains or causes
- 4 the arrest of any person shall not be held civilly liable for detention, slander,
- 5 malicious prosecution, false imprisonment, or false arrest of the person detained or
- 6 arrested, whether the detention or arrest takes place by the merchant or by his agent
- 7 or employee, if in detaining or in causing the arrest of the person, the merchant or the
- 8 agent or employee of the merchant had, at the time of the detention or arrest,
- 9 probable cause to believe that the person committed the crime of "theft," as prohibited
- $10\,$ by \S 7-104 of the Criminal Law Article, of property of the merchant from the premises
- 11 of the merchant.

- 32 knowingly transfer or cause to be transferred any sounds recorded on a recorded
- 33 article to any other recorded article:
- 34 (i) with the intent to sell or cause to be sold for profit or used to
- 35 promote the sale of any product; and
- 36 (ii) without the consent of the owner of the original fixation of
- 37 sounds embodied in the master recorded article.
