- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 3 (f) A person may not catch oysters in the waters of the State or possess any 4 scoop, dredge, handscrape, or similar instrument having a tooth bar more than 42 5 inches in length measuring from the outside teeth on dredges used in dredging on 6 rock bottoms or 44 inches in length measuring from the outside teeth on dredges used
- 7 in dredging on mud bottoms, or of a weight exceeding 200 pounds. [The captain or
- 8 any other person may not possess or use a "devil catcher" or "devil diver", or similar
- 9 device on any dredge boat to be attached to the dredge for steering it to the bottom.]
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to § 2-1246 of the
- 11 State Government Article and on or before September 30, 2007, the Department of
- 12 Natural Resources shall report to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental
- 13 Affairs Committee and the House Environmental Matters Committee regarding the
- 14 environmental impacts of the use of "devil catchers", "devil divers", and other similar
- 15 *devices on dredge boats that may be attached to the dredge for steering to the bottom,*
- 16 including the primary areas where these devices are utilized and the extent of use in
- 17 those areas.
- 18 SECTION 2.—3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 19 effect October 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end
- 20 of September 30, 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 21 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
