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A BILL ENTITLED

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2 State Lottery - Unanticipated Revenues

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Comptroller to distribute certain unanticipated
- 4 lottery revenues to counties and municipal corporations on a certain pro rata
- 5 basis; defining a certain term; requiring the funds distributed under this Act to
- 6 be appropriated in a certain manner by the recipients for public education and
- 7 public safety purposes; and generally relating to the distribution of State lottery
- 8 revenues.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - State Government

- 17 9-120.
- 18 (a) The Comptroller shall distribute the State Lottery Fund to pay:
- 19 (1) on a pro rata basis for the daily and nondaily State lottery games, the
- 20 expenses of administering and operating the State lottery, as authorized under this
- 21 subtitle and the State budget; and
- 22 (2) then, except as provided in § 10-113.1 of the Family Law Article and
- 23 § 11-618 of the Criminal Procedure Article, the holder of each winning ticket or share.
- 24 (b) (1) [Promptly] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS
- 25 SECTION, PROMPTLY after the 1st day of each month, the Comptroller shall pay:
- 26 (i) into the Maryland Stadium Facilities Fund the money that
- 27 remains in the State Lottery Fund from the proceeds of the sports lotteries conducted

- 1 for the benefit of the Maryland Stadium Authority, after the distribution under 2 subsection (a) of this section; and 3 (ii) into the General Fund of the State the money that remains in 4 the State Lottery Fund from the proceeds of all other lotteries after the distribution 5 under subsection (a) of this section. The money paid into the General Fund under this subsection is 6 (2) 7 available in the fiscal year in which the money accumulates in the State Lottery 8 Fund. 9 IN THIS SUBSECTION, "UNANTICIPATED REVENUES" MEANS STATE (C) (1)10 LOTTERY REVENUES THAT EXCEED BUDGETARY PROJECTIONS FOR A FISCAL YEAR. IF THE STATE LOTTERY RECEIVES UNANTICIPATED REVENUES FOR 12 A FISCAL YEAR, THE COMPTROLLER: 13 (I) MAY NOT DISTRIBUTE INTO THE GENERAL FUND ANY OF THE 14 UNANTICIPATED REVENUES; AND 15 SHALL DISTRIBUTE TO EACH COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL 16 CORPORATION THE UNANTICIPATED REVENUES ON A PRO RATA BASIS ACCORDING 17 TO THE TOTAL LOTTERY SALES MADE IN EACH OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS. FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE PRO RATA DISTRIBUTION TO COUNTIES 18 (3)19 AND MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 20 SUBSECTION, LOTTERY SALES MADE IN A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION MAY NOT BE 21 INCLUDED IN THE CALCULATION OF LOTTERY SALES FOR THE COUNTY IN WHICH 22 THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION IS LOCATED. 23 (4) A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION SHALL APPROPRIATE THE 24 UNANTICIPATED REVENUES IT RECEIVES EQUALLY BETWEEN PUBLIC SCHOOL 25 EXPENSES AND PUBLIC SAFETY EXPENSES.
- 26 [(c)] (D) The regulations of the Agency shall apportion the money in the State 27 Lottery Fund.
- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 29 effect July 1, 2004.
