	(c) (1) Any resident of this State who is retired from the work force by reason of total and permanent disability who enrolls at a community college in a class that has at least 10 regularly enrolled students:			
19	(i) Is exempt from payment of tuition; and			
20 21	(ii) Shall be counted in computing full-time equivalent enrollment under § 16-305 of this title.			
24	(2) In order to receive this exemption, an individual shall obtain certification from the Social Security Administration or the Railroad Retirement Board that the individual receives disability [and] OR retirement benefits under the Social Security Act or the Railroad Retirement Act.			

3	1 (3) In order to obtain this exemption, an individual who was a federal 2 employee and who does not receive disability [and] OR retirement benefits under the 3 Social Security Act or the Railroad Retirement Act shall obtain certification from the 4 individual's federal retirement or pension authority of the employee's:

6 7	6 (ii) Receipt of disability benefits based on a standard that is at least 7 as stringent as the standard applied by the Social Security Act.
