12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (c) (1) Any resident of this State who is retired from the work force by 17 reason of total and permanent disability who enrolls at a community college in a class 18 that has at least 10 regularly enrolled students:
19 (i) Is exempt from payment of tuition; and

- 1 (ii) Shall be counted in computing full-time equivalent enrollment 2 under § 16-305 of this title. In order to receive this exemption, an individual shall obtain 3 4 certification from the Social Security Administration or the Railroad Retirement 5 Board that the individual receives disability [and] OR retirement benefits under the 6 Social Security Act or the Railroad Retirement Act. 7 In order to obtain this exemption, an individual who was a federal 8 employee and who does not receive disability [and] OR retirement benefits under the 9 Social Security Act or the Railroad Retirement Act shall obtain certification from the 10 individual's federal retirement or pension authority of the employee's: 11 Total and permanent disability; and (i) 12 (ii) Receipt of disability benefits based on a standard that is at least 13 as stringent as the standard applied by the Social Security Act.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 July 1, 2004.
