SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
effect October 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 3 months
and, at the end of December 31, 2006, with no further action required by the General
Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
