

- 11 (8) A TRANSFER FROM THE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' RETIREMENT
- 12 SYSTEM TO THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' PENSION SYSTEM UNDER § 26-203.2
- 13 OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a member of the Internal
- 15 Investigative Unit of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services on
- 16 September 30, 2004, shall be a member of the Division of Police Services of the
- 17 Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services on the effective date of this
- 18 Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a member of the Internal
- 20 Investigative Unit of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services on
- 21 September 30, 2004, who becomes a member of the Division of Police Services of the
