HOUSE BILL 383

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Election Law

4 5-305.

THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY TO A PETITION THAT WILL AFFECT THE 5 (A)6 RIGHT OF A CANDIDATE TO HAVE THE CANDIDATE'S NAME APPEAR ON THE BALLOT 7 IN A PRIMARY OR GENERAL ELECTION.

ANY A REGISTERED VOTER WHO IS A RESIDENT OF THE DISTRICT OR 8 (A)(B)9 OTHER GEOGRAPHIC AREA IN WHICH A CANDIDATE IS SEEKING OFFICE MAY FILE A 10 PETITION WITH THE CIRCUIT COURT THAT CHALLENGES FOR THAT DISTRICT OR 11 GEOGRAPHIC AREA TO CHALLENGE THE CANDIDATE'S RESIDENCY AS PROVIDED IN § 12 5-202 OF THIS TITLE.

THE PETITION SHALL BE FILED WITHIN 7 DAYS FROM THE DATE THE (B) (1)13 14 CANDIDATE'S CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY IS FILED UNDER § 5-302 OF THIS 15 SUBTITLE AFTER THE DEADLINE SPECIFIED UNDER § 5 303 OF THIS SUBTITLE FOR 16 THE FILING OF A CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY FOR THE OFFICE THAT THE

17 CANDIDATE IS SEEKING.

18 (C)(1)THE PETITION MUST BE FILED:

19 IF THE PETITION INVOLVES A CHALLENGE TO A CANDIDATE (I)

20 FOR AN OFFICE THAT IS TO BE CONTESTED AT AN ELECTION IN THE YEAR THAT 21 THERE IS NOT A PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION, NO LATER THAN 9 WEEKS BEFORE THAT 22 ELECTION; OR

23 IF THE PETITION INVOLVES A CHALLENGE TO A CANDIDATE (II)24 FOR AN OFFICE THAT IS TO BE CONTESTED AT AN ELECTION IN THE YEAR OF A 25 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION, NO LATER THAN 11 WEEKS BEFORE THAT ELECTION.

JUDICIAL REVIEW OF ANY PETITION THAT IS FILED UNDER 26 (2)27 SUBSECTION (A) (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE EXPEDITED BY THE CIRCUIT COURT 28 THAT HEARS THE CAUSE TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY IN CONSIDERATION OF THE 29 DEADLINES ESTABLISHED BY LAW, AND IN NO CASE, LONGER THAN 7 DAYS FROM 30 THE DATE THE PETITION IS FILED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 32 July 1, 2004.
