

## A BILL ENTITLED 1 AN ACT concerning 2 Real Property - Task Force on Business Owner Compensation in 3 **Condemnation Proceedings** 4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force on Business Owner Compensation in 5 Condemnation Proceedings; providing for the membership of the Task Force; 6 providing for the designation of a chairman of the Task Force; providing for staff 7 for the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving 8 compensation; authorizing a member of the Task Force to receive 9 reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study certain issues; requiring the Task Force to report its preliminary findings to the 10 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the 11 Task Force to report its final findings to the Governor and the General Assembly 12 13 on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the establishment of a Task Force on Business Owner 14 15 Compensation in Condemnation Proceedings. SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 17 MARYLAND, That: 18 There is a Task Force on Business Owner Compensation in Condemnation (a) 19 Proceedings. The Task Force consists of the following members: 20 (b) three members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President 21 (1) 22 of the Senate; 23 (2) three members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker 24 of the House: 25 one representative of the Department of Business and Economic 26 Development, designated by the Secretary of Business and Economic Development; 27 (4) one representative of the Department of Housing and Community

28 Development, designated by the Secretary of Housing and Community Development;

- 1 (1) report its preliminary findings to the Governor and, subject to § 2 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before January 3 31, 2005; and
- 4 (2) report its final findings to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of 5 the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2005.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 7 October 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 3 months and, at
- 8 the end of December 31, 2005, with no further action required by the General
- 9 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
