## 1 AN ACT concerning

- 2 Education High School Diploma World War II, Korean Conflict, and 3 Vietnam Conflict Veterans
- 4 FOR the purpose of allowing an individual honorably discharged from military
- 5 service to apply to certain county boards of education to obtain a high school
- 6 diploma if the individual withdrew from a certain full-time public or private
- 7 school under certain circumstances; and generally relating to high school

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 7-206.1.

- 18 (a) An individual honorably discharged from military service may apply to
- 19 obtain a high school diploma if the individual withdrew from a regular full-time

- $1 \;\; \text{public or private high school accredited by the State Board to enlist in the armed}$
- 2 forces of the United States during:
- 3 (1) World War II [or the];
- 4 (2) THE Korean Conflict; OR
- 5 (3) THE VIETNAM CONFLICT.
- 6 (b) To obtain a high school diploma under subsection (a) of this section, the 7 individual shall apply to the county board in the county where the individual resides 8 or where the school from which the individual withdrew was located.
- 9 (c) Each county board shall adopt rules and regulations to establish 10 procedures for awarding diplomas under this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2004.
