Any bona fide hotel or motel may obtain a special Class B 4 (3) 5 (on-sale) beer, wine and liquor license issued by the Board of License Commissioners 6 providing: It is an establishment for the accommodation of the public 7 1. 8 providing services ordinarily found in bona fide hotels and motels; 9 2. It contains no less than 15 rooms [or, if a bed and 10 breakfast-type facility, 8 rooms]; It contains a dining room with facilities for preparing and 11 3. 12 serving full-course meals for at least 50 persons at one seating; and 13 4. The capital investment in the hotel or motel facility is not 14 less than \$400,000. THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY ISSUE A CLASS 15 (I) 16 B-BB (BED AND BREAKFAST) ON-SALE BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE FOR THE 17 USE OF AN ESTABLISHMENT THAT: 18 1. PROVIDES SERVICES ORDINARILY FOUND IN A BED AND 19 BREAKFAST ESTABLISHMENT; AND 20 2. CONTAINS AT LEAST ONE ROOM WITH SLEEPING 21 ACCOMMODATIONS, EXCLUDING RESIDENT MANAGEMENT QUARTERS, THAT THE 22 PUBLIC FOR CONSIDERATION MAY USE FOR A SPECIFIED TIME. 23 THE HOLDER OF A CLASS B-BB LICENSE MAY SELL ALCOHOLIC (II)24 BEVERAGES ONLY: 25 1. FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES DURING THE 26 HOURS AND DAYS THAT ARE PERMITTED FOR A CLASS B ON-SALE BEER, WINE AND 27 LIQUOR LICENSE ISSUED IN THE COUNTY; AND TO A GUEST WHOSE NAME AND ADDRESS APPEARS ON 28 29 THE REGISTRY THAT IS MAINTAINED BY THE ESTABLISHMENT AND WHO IS AN 30 OCCUPANT OF A SLEEPING ROOM IN THE ESTABLISHMENT. THE HOLDER OF A CLASS B-BB LICENSE MAY NOT SELL 31 (III)32 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO A PERSON WHO IS REGISTERED AT THE ESTABLISHMENT 33 ONLY TO OBTAIN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES. 34 (IV) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$500.
