2 Criminal Law - Interference with Commercial Athletic Event - Prohibited

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain persons from disrupting or interfering with a
- commercial athletic contest by entering unlawfully on the playing field or 4
- 5 assaulting any athletic contestant, athlete, coach, manager, umpire, or referee
- 6 on the playing field; defining a certain term; providing that a certain sentence
- may be imposed separate from and consecutive to or concurrent with a sentence 7
- 8 for any crime based on the act establishing a certain violation; and generally

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article - Criminal Law**

- 20 In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) (1)
- 21 "Commercial athletic contest" means an athletic or sporting event
- 22 held in a public arena, field, hall, or stadium for admission to which the general
- 23 public must pay an admission charge.
- 24 "Object" means an item that may cause injury to a participant in or
- 25 observer of the commercial athletic contest.
- 26 (4) "PLAYING FIELD" MEANS A FIELD, COURT, RING, RINK, TRACK,
- 27 BENCH AREA, SIDELINE, FOUL TERRITORY, BULLPEN, DUGOUT, COACHES' BOX,
- 28 PENALTY BOX, OR OTHER AREA WHERE AN ATHLETE OR ATHLETIC TEAM OR LEAGUE

- $1\,$ PERSONNEL MAY BE PRESENT AND WHERE ACCESS BY THE GENERAL PUBLIC IS
- 2 GENERALLY PROHIBITED DURING AN ATHLETIC OR SPORTING EVENT.
- $\qquad \qquad \text{(b)} \qquad \text{A [person] NON-PARTICIPANT IN THE CONTEST may not disrupt or } \\$
- 4 interfere with a commercial athletic contest by:
- 5 (1) throwing or projecting an object on the playing field or seating area;
- 6 (2) ENTERING UNLAWFULLY ON THE PLAYING FIELD; OR
- 7 (3) ASSAULTING ANY ATHLETIC CONTESTANT, ATHLETE, MANAGER, 8 COACH, UMPIRE, OR REFEREE ON THE PLAYING FIELD.
- 9 (c) (1) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on
- 10 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 3 months or a fine not exceeding
- 11 \$250 or both.
- 12 (2) A SENTENCE IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE IMPOSED
- 13 SEPARATE FROM AND CONSECUTIVE TO OR CONCURRENT WITH A SENTENCE FOR
- 14 ANY CRIME BASED ON THE ACT ESTABLISHING THE VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION.
- 15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 16 June 1, 2004.
