Worcester County - Liquor Dispensaries - Homeowners Associations

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing liquor dispensaries in Worcester County to be

- 4 established and maintained in a housing development, with a certain
- 5 <u>population, that is overseen</u> by a homeowners association with a certain
- 6 minimum membership and that has a special police force commissioned under
- 7 <u>State law;</u> requiring that a certain percentage of net profits from the operation
- 8 of dispensaries be paid to <u>a</u> certain homeowners associations association for the
- 9 <u>benefit of its special police force</u> according to a certain formula; and generally
- 10 relating to liquor dispensaries in Worcester County.
- 11 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 12 Article 2B Alcoholic Beverages
- 13 Section 15-203(f) and 15-207(h)
- 14 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 15 (2001 Replacement Volume and 2003 Supplement)
- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

- 20 (f) In Worcester County the county liquor dispensaries may be established
- 21 and maintained only at Pocomoke City, Snow Hill, Berlin and Ocean City, OR IN A
- 22 HOUSING DEVELOPMENT WITH A POPULATION OF AT LEAST 10,000 THAT IS
- 23 OVERSEEN BY A HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION WITH A MEMBERSHIP OF AT LEAST

1 10,000 AND THAT HAS A SPECIAL POLICE FORCE COMMISSIONED UNDER TITLE 3,

2 SUBTITLE 3 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE, and in any rural areas that may be 3 approved by the Liquor Control Board and the County Commissioners of Worcester

4 County.

This subsection applies only in Worcester County. (1)

7 (2)All net profits arising from the operation of these dispensaries are 8 first applied towards the payment of any and all sums advanced to or borrowed by the

Liquor Control Board. After these sums are paid, the Board is authorized to create 9

10 and maintain a reserve fund not to exceed \$400,000. The reserve fund is maintained

11 to provide adequate working capital and to meet any losses that may be sustained by

12 the Board in the operation of these dispensaries.

13 (3)Fifty percent of all net profits in excess of the reserve fund shall be

14 paid to the County Commissioners of Worcester County on or before June 1 each year.

15 The remaining 50 percent shall be paid on or before June 1 each year to the mayors

16 and city councils of Berlin, Ocean City, Pocomoke City, and Snow Hill, AND TO ALL

17 HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS THAT ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN OVERSEE A

18 HOUSING DEVELOPMENT IN WHICH A LIQUOR DISPENSARY HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED

19 IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 15-203(F) OF THIS SUBTITLE, in proportion to the net profits

20 on total sales of the dispensaries situated in each of these municipalities AND

21 HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS. For purposes of calculating the municipalities' share

22 and if the County Commissioners consent to it for each municipality, a radius of 2

23 miles outside of the municipal boundaries shall be considered as being within the

24 corporate limits. In the rural areas outside of the 2-mile radius of those

25 municipalities, the net profits shall go to the general funds of Worcester County.

26 The amounts paid to the mayors and city councils of Berlin, (4)(I) 27 Ocean City, Pocomoke City, and Snow Hill shall be used for general municipal 28 purposes.

29 THE AMOUNTS PAID TO THE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS (II)

30 SHALL BE USED FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE SPECIAL POLICE FORCES OF THE

31 HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS IN WHICH A LIQUOR DISPENSARY HAS BEEN

32 ESTABLISHED.

33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 34 effect June 1, 2004.
