- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article 10 - Legal Officials

- 15 (v) In Washington County,
- The State's Attorney's salary shall be 90 percent of the salary of a 16 (1) 17 judge of the District Court of Maryland.
- 18 The State's Attorney shall appoint [a] TWO deputy State's (2)
- 19 [Attorney] ATTORNEYS, whose [salary is] SALARIES ARE to be determined by the
- 20 County Commissioners.
- 21 The State's Attorney shall appoint the number of assistant State's (3)
- 22 Attorneys approved by the County Commissioners and provided for in the
- 23 Washington County budget. The salaries of the assistant State's Attorneys are to be
- 24 determined by the County Commissioners.
- 25 (4) The deputy State's [Attorney] ATTORNEYS and the assistant State's
- 26 Attorneys shall serve at the pleasure of the State's Attorney. Under the direction of
- 27 the State's Attorney or in the absence of the State's Attorney, the deputy State's

- 1 [Attorney] ATTORNEYS and the assistant State's Attorneys shall perform acts and 2 duties in relation to all criminal proceedings, all having the same legal powers as the
- 3 State's Attorney, to represent the State in all proceedings in relation to grand jury,
- 4 circuit court, the District Court, boards, commissions or agencies of this State or any
- 5 county or political subdivision.
- 6 The State's Attorney may not engage in the private practice of law at 7 any time in any jurisdiction during his tenure of office.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8
- 9 October 1, 2004.
