4 FOR the purpose of altering the maximum amounts of certain classes of alcoholic
5 beverages licenses available to be issued in Prince George's County; eliminating
6 a certain class of alcoholic beverages license in the county; providing that the
7 additional Class B licenses authorized by this Act and issued under State law do
8 not confer off-sale privileges; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages
9 licenses in Prince George's County.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (b) The number of licenses of each class of alcoholic beverage licenses may not
4 exceed the following maximum amounts:

5	(6)	Beer and light wine license, Class B	[38] 45
6	(12)	Beer, wine and liquor license, Class B	[170] 185
7	(15)	Beer, wine and liquor license, Class BH	[20] 25
8	[(16)	Beer, wine and liquor license, Class B/Arena	1]

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any additional Class B
10 license authorized by this Act and issued under Article 2B, § 9-217 of the Annotated
11 Code of Maryland does not confer off-sale privileges.
