- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 1 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages** 2 6-201. 3 (r) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Prince George's County. 4 (10)(i) There is a special Class B license known as Class B-CI. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (VIII) OF THIS 5 (vii) 6 PARAGRAPH, A Class B-CI LICENSEE [licenses are limited and restricted to the purpose of providing MAY PROVIDE alcoholic beverages for consumption on the 8 licensed premises only[, with no off-sale privileges to be exercised therewith]. 9 (VIII) A CLASS B-CI LICENSEE MAY HOLD A WINE TASTING EVENT IN 10 WHICH PATRONS MAY PURCHASE WINE FOR CONSUMPTION OFF THE LICENSED 11 PREMISES. 12 [(viii)] (IX) The Board may not issue more than two Class B-CI 13 licenses.

- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 15 June 1, 2004.
