5 hold wine tasting events in which patrons may purchase wine for consumption

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

4 6-201.

5 (r) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Prince George's County.

6 (10) (i) There is a special Class B license known as Class B-CI.

7 (vii) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (VIII) OF THIS
8 PARAGRAPH, A Class B-CI LICENSEE [licenses are limited and restricted to the
9 purpose of providing] MAY PROVIDE alcoholic beverages for consumption on the
10 licensed premises only[, with no off-sale privileges to be exercised therewith].

11 (VIII) A CLASS B-CI LICENSEE MAY HOLD A WINE TASTING EVENT IN
12 WHICH PATRONS MAY PURCHASE WINE FOR CONSUMPTION OFF THE LICENSED
13 PREMISES.

14 [(viii)] (IX) The Board may not issue more than two Class B-CI
15 licenses.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
17 June 1, 2004.
