- 16 (a) When soliciting the sale of a health insurance policy, a carrier or insurance
- 17 producer may not knowingly offer a Medicare supplement policy to an individual not

- 20 offer to sell a Medicare supplement policy to an individual eligible for Medicaid

- 22 [(c)] (B) A carrier or insurance producer may not negligently or knowingly sell
- 23 or offer to sell to an individual a Medicare supplement policy that duplicates to any
- 24 extent an existing Medicare supplement policy that covers that individual.

- 4 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health
- 5 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the
- 6 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take
- 7 effect from the date it is enacted.
