1 (3) THE FREQUENCY OF CHARITABLE GAMING EVENTS HELD UNDER 2 THIS SECTION BY ANY ONE PERMITTEE MAY NOT EXCEED ONE PER WEEK.

3 (H) (1) AN APPLICATION FORM TO BE SUBMITTED FOR ISSUANCE OR

4 RENEWAL OF A CHARITABLE GAMING PERMIT SHALL BE PREPARED BY THE COUNTY 5 AND SHALL CONTAIN ANY INFORMATION THE COUNTY CONSIDERS NECESSARY OR 6 HELPFUL IN MAKING A DECISION ON THE ISSUANCE OR RENEWAL OF A PERMIT.

- 7 (2) THE COUNTY MAY REJECT AN APPLICATION IF A DETERMINATION IS 8 MADE THAT:
- 9 (I) ANY INFORMATION IN THE APPLICATION IS FALSE OR 10 MISLEADING: OR
- 11 (II) THE OPERATION OF A CHARITABLE GAMING EVENT IS NOT 12 NECESSARY FOR THE ACCOMMODATION OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC OR WOULD
- 13 DISTURB THE PEACE, CREATE A NUISANCE, OR BE DETRIMENTAL TO THE MORALS,
- 14 HEALTH, OR WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY.
- 15 (3) (I) THE COUNTY SHALL REVIEW AN APPLICATION WITHIN 30 DAYS 16 OF RECEIVING IT.
- 17 (II) THE COUNTY SHALL APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE, IN WRITING,
- 18 THE APPLICATION WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE COMPLETION OF THE REVIEW AND
- 19 PROMPTLY NOTIFY THE APPLICANT OF THE ACTION TAKEN.
- 20 (4) IF AN APPLICATION IS REJECTED, THE APPLICANT SHALL BE GIVEN
- 21 THE OPPORTUNITY FOR A HEARING AFTER REASONABLE NOTICE IS GIVEN TO THE
- 22 APPLICANT.
- 23 (I) THE NET PROCEEDS FROM CHARITABLE GAMING EVENTS CONDUCTED
- 24 UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE USED ONLY FOR PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY
- 25 CHARITIES, COMMUNITY GRANTS, OR THE PURCHASE AND MAINTENANCE OF FIRE
- 26 FIGHTING EQUIPMENT AND APPARATUS.
- 27 (J) IN ADDITION TO ANY REPORTS REQUIRED BY THE COUNTY UNDER
- 28 COUNTY ORDINANCES, ON OR BEFORE JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR, EACH PERSON, GROUP,
- 29 OR ORGANIZATION OPERATING UNDER THIS SECTION AS A CHARITABLE GAMING
- 30 EVENT PERMITTEE DURING THE PRECEDING 12 MONTHS SHALL REPORT UNDER
- 31 AFFIDAVIT TO THE COMPTROLLER OF THE TREASURY, THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND
- 32 COUNTY COUNCIL OF PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, AND THE PRINCE GEORGE'S
- 33 COUNTY HOUSE AND SENATE DELEGATIONS IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON:
- 34 (1) THE TOTAL GROSS RECEIPTS FROM CHARITABLE GAMING EVENTS IN
- 35 PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY FOR THE 12-MONTH PERIOD:
- 36 (2) AN ITEMIZATION OF THE EXPENSES DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE
- 37 GAMING ACTIVITIES FOR THE 12-MONTH PERIOD; AND

- 1 (3) THE DISPOSITION OF ALL NET INCOME RELATED TO THE GAMING 2 ACTIVITIES FOR THE 12-MONTH PERIOD.
- 3 (K) A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY MAKE A FALSE, FICTITIOUS, OR
- 4 FRAUDULENT REPRESENTATION IN A PERMIT APPLICATION, TAX SUBMISSION,
- 5 RECORD, REPORT, OR AS PART OF ANY OTHER DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED UNDER
- 6 THIS SECTION OR UNDER A COUNTY ORDINANCE ADOPTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 7 THIS SECTION.
- 8 (L) (1) A PERSON THAT CONDUCTS A CHARITABLE GAMING EVENT IN 9 VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING
- 10 PENALTIES:
- 11 (I) FOR THE FIRST VIOLATION, A 30-DAY SUSPENSION OF THE
- 12 PERMIT AND A \$500 CIVIL PENALTY;
- 13 (II) FOR A SECOND VIOLATION, A 6-MONTH SUSPENSION OF THE
- 14 PERMIT AND A \$3,000 CIVIL PENALTY; AND
- 15 (III) FOR A THIRD VIOLATION, REVOCATION OF THE PERMIT AND A
- 16 \$10,000 CIVIL PENALTY.
- 17 (2) A PERSON THAT VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION OR A
- 18 PROVISION OF THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY CODE ADOPTED WITH RESPECT TO
- 19 THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A
- 20 FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 3 YEARS OR BOTH.
