- 1 Maryland Senior Rides Demonstration Program. The evaluation shall include the
- 2 number, size, type, and location of projects funded by the Program; the extent to
- 3 which the Program is filling the need for door-to-door transportation for low-income
- 4 to moderate-income seniors as those terms are defined in § 7-1001 of the
- 5 Transportation Article as enacted by this Act; any innovations in public-private
- 6 cooperation and risk management that result from the Program; and any other
- 7 information necessary to effectively evaluate the Program.
- 8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 9 July 1, <del>2004</del> <u>2005</u>.
