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Transportation - Maryland Senior Rides Demonstration Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Senior Rides Demonstration Program

- 4 within the Maryland Transit Administration; establishing the purpose of and
- 5 certain criteria for the participation in and the awarding of grants under the
- 6 Program; requiring the Administration to consult with certain parties regarding

7 the awarding of grants and the adoption of regulations under this Act;

- 8 authorizing grant participants to provide certain services; requiring the
- 9 Administration to adopt certain regulations; requiring Program participants to
- 10 submit certain reports to the Administration; requiring the Administration to
- 11 submit certain evaluations to the General Assembly; providing for a delayed
- 12 <u>effective date;</u> and generally relating to the Maryland Senior Rides
- 13 Demonstration Program.

Preamble

2 WHEREAS, Senior citizens in Maryland face unique challenges in accessing
3 safe, available, and affordable transportation for a variety of medical, routine, social,
4 and personal needs; and

5 WHEREAS, The federal, State, and local resources available to subsidize 6 transportation for seniors, and the existing transportation services offered by State, 7 local, and private providers, do not adequately meet the needs of seniors for 8 door-to-door, nonfixed-route, and on-demand transportation options; and

9 WHEREAS, The transportation challenges faced by seniors vary significantly
10 across the State depending on whether they live in urban, suburban, or rural settings;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, Senior citizens make up more than 15% of Maryland's population 13 and, by 2020, that percentage is expected to grow to 23%; now, therefore,

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 20 INDICATED.

(B) "DOOR-TO-DOOR TRANSPORTATION" MEANS PROVIDING, THROUGH
PREARRANGED APPOINTMENT, SAFE ESCORT FROM A DEPARTURE POINT, INTO AND
OUT OF A TRANSPORT VEHICLE AND TO THE DOOR OF THE DESTINATION.

24 (C) "LOW-INCOME TO MODERATE-INCOME" MEANS THE HOUSEHOLD INCOME
25 OF AN INDIVIDUAL DOES NOT EXCEED 400% OF THE POVERTY THRESHOLD THAT IS
26 ESTABLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, BUREAU OF
27 STATISTICS FOR A GIVEN YEAR.

(D) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE MARYLAND SENIOR RIDES DEMONSTRATION
 29 PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

30 (E) "PROGRAM APPLICANT" MEANS A GOVERNMENT AGENCY, NONPROFIT
31 ENTITY, OR FAITH-BASED AGENCY THAT PROVIDES TRANSPORTATION SERVICES
32 AND IS EXEMPT FROM TAXATION UNDER § 501 (C)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE
33 CODE.

34 (F) "PROGRAM PARTICIPANT" MEANS A PROGRAM APPLICANT THAT HAS BEEN
 35 APPROVED FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM.

3 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND SENIOR RIDES DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM IN THE 4 ADMINISTRATION.

5 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO ENCOURAGE REGIONAL
6 PROVIDERS TO PROVIDE DOOR-TO-DOOR TRANSPORTATION FOR LOW-INCOME TO
7 MODERATE-INCOME SENIORS.

8 (C) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL AWARD A GRANT TO QUALIFIED PROGRAM
9 APPLICANTS, AS PROVIDED IN § 7-1003 OF THIS SUBTITLE, FOR THE OPERATION OF
10 TRANSPORTATION SERVICES AS SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION.

18 (3) USE A DISPATCHER SYSTEM TO RESPOND QUICKLY TO REQUESTS
19 FROM LOW-INCOME TO MODERATE-INCOME SENIORS FOR TRANSPORTATION TO
20 AND FROM APPOINTMENTS; AND

21 (4) DEFINE A GEOGRAPHIC AREA FOR WHICH DOOR-TO-DOOR 22 TRANSPORTATION IS PROVIDED.

(E) A PROGRAM PARTICIPANT MAY PROVIDE DOOR-TO-DOOR
TRANSPORTATION TO AN ELIGIBLE SENIOR WHO DOES NOT RESIDE IN THE
GEOGRAPHIC AREA DEFINED BY THE PROGRAM PARTICIPANT UNDER SUBSECTION
(D)(4) OF THIS SECTION WHEN APPLYING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM, SO
LONG AS SERVICE IS NOT DIMINISHED TO AN ELIGIBLE SENIOR WHO DOES RESIDE IN

(F) A PROGRAM PARTICIPANT SHALL EXPEND A MATCHING FUND OF AT
LEAST 25% OF THE TOTAL CAPITAL OR OPERATING COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH
PROVIDING DOOR-TO-DOOR TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR LOW-INCOME TO
MODERATE-INCOME SENIORS.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Transit

4 Administration, on or before November 1 of each year, shall submit to the General

5 Assembly, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, an evaluation of the

6 Maryland Senior Rides Demonstration Program. The evaluation shall include the

7 number, size, type, and location of projects funded by the Program; the extent to

8 which the Program is filling the need for door-to-door transportation for low-income

9 to moderate-income seniors as those terms are defined in § 7-1001 of the

10 Transportation Article as enacted by this Act; any innovations in public-private

11 cooperation and risk management that result from the Program; and any other

12 information necessary to effectively evaluate the Program.
