	(2) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS PERFORMING AURICULAR DETOXIFICATION TO WHICH AN ACUPUNCTURIST LICENSED BY THE BOARD MAY PROVIDE SUPERVISION; AND					
	(3) The requirements for the approval of a clinical substance abuse program or a setting where an individual may perform auricular detoxification under the [direct] supervision of an acupuncturist licensed by the Board.

14	(2) An acupuncturist who is licensed by the Board is responsible for assuring the Board that the individual performing auricular detoxification under the [direct] supervision of the acupuncturist complies with all applicable laws, regulations, and standards of practice.

[It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of September 30, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. On or before January 1, 2004, an evaluation of this Act recommending reestablishment or termination of this Act shall be prepared by the State Acupuncture Board in consultation with the Maryland Acupuncture Society and other affected parties, and shall be submitted to the Governor, and in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.]
