## **Biological Agents Registry Program**

3 FOR the purpose of providing requiring the Department of Health and Mental

4 Hygiene to adopt regulations that require local jurisdictions to be informed of

5 the location and nature of certain biological agents in the Biological Agents

6 <u>Registry and provide</u> for the release of certain information to certain units of

7 government, certain police officers, and certain fire or emergency medical

8 services entities; prohibiting disclosure of certain information to another person

9 or entity unless authorized; defining certain terms; requiring the Department to

10 adopt certain regulations in consultation with certain groups; clarifying the

11 definition of a certain term; and generally relating to the Biological Agents

12 Registry Program in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 Article - Health - General 9 17-601. 10 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. 11 (b) "Biological agent" means[: 12 Any select agent that is a microorganism, virus, bacterium, fungus, (1)13 rickettsia, or toxin listed in Title 42, Part 72, Appendix A of the Code of Federal 14 Regulations; 15 Any genetically modified microorganisms or genetic elements from (2)16 an organism listed in Title 42, Part 72, Appendix A of the Code of Federal Regulations, shown to produce or encode for a factor associated with a disease; or 17 18 Any genetically modified microorganisms or genetic elements that (3)19 contain nucleic acid sequences coding for any of the toxins listed in Title 42, Part 72, 20 Appendix A of the Code of Federal Regulations, or their toxic submits] ANY 21 BIOLOGICAL AGENT AS DEFINED IN TITLE 42, PART 73 OF THE CODE OF FEDERAL 22 REGULATIONS, OR TITLE 9, PART 121 OF THE CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS. 23 (C) "MARYLAND INSTITUTE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEMS" 24 MEANS THE UNIT DESCRIBED IN § 13-503 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE. 25 "PERSON" INCLUDES STATE AND FEDERAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT. (D) 26 [(c)] (E) "Program" means the Biological Agents Registry Program. 27 17-602. There is a Biological Agents Registry Program in the Department. 28 (a) 29 (b) The Biological Agents Registry shall: 30 (1)Identify the biological agents possessed and maintained by any person in this State; and 31 32 (2)Contain other information as required by regulations adopted by the 33 Department.

The Department shall adopt regulations for the implementation of the 1 (c) 2 Program that: 3 (1)Determine and list the biological agents required to be reported 4 under this subtitle; 5 Designate the persons required to make reports and the specific (2)6 information required to be reported; 7 Designate time limits for reporting, the form of reports, and the (3)persons to whom reports are to be submitted; 8 REQUIRE LOCAL JURISDICTIONS TO BE INFORMED OF THE 9 (4)10 LOCATION AND NATURE OF EACH BIOLOGICAL AGENT IN THE REGISTRY THAT IS LOCATED WITHIN THE LOCAL JURISDICTION; 11 12 (4) (5) Provide for the release of SPECIFIED information in the 13 Biological Agents Registry to: 14 State and federal law enforcement agencies and the Centers for (I) 15 Disease Control and Prevention pursuant to a communicable disease investigation 16 commenced or conducted by the Department or other State or federal law enforcement agency having investigatory authority, or in connection with any 17 investigation involving release, theft, or loss of biological agents; 18 19 THE MARYLAND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY AND THE (II) 20 MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF PLANNING 21 FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC IN RELATION TO THE RELEASE OF A 22 BIOLOGICAL AGENT AND THE PREVENTION OF A RELEASE OF A BIOLOGICAL AGENT; 23 AND 24 (III) THE MARYLAND INSTITUTE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL 25 SERVICES SYSTEMS FOR THE PURPOSES OF PROVIDING CERTAIN SPECIFIED 26 INFORMATION TO: A FIRE OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ENTITY, AS DEFINED 27 IN § 7-101 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE, PERFORMING EMERGENCY SERVICES, 28 PROCEEDING TO A FIRE OR OTHER EMERGENCY, OR DISPATCHED ON A CALL FOR 29 EMERGENCY SERVICES; 30 A POLICE OFFICER, AS DEFINED IN § 3-201(E) OF THE 1. 31 PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE, RESPONDING TO AN EMERGENCY; AND 32 A FIRE, RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES 2.

33 ENTITY, AS DEFINED IN § 7-101 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE, PERFORMING 34 EMERGENCY SERVICES, RESPONDING TO A FIRE OR OTHER EMERGENCY, OR 35 DISPATCHED ON A CALL FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES;

Establish a system of safeguards that requires persons 36 (5)(6)

37 possessing, maintaining, and transferring biological agents subject to this subtitle to 38 comply with the same federal standards that apply to persons registered to transfer

39 the same agents under federal law; and

1(6)(7)Establish a process for persons that possess and maintain2biological agents to alert appropriate authorities of unauthorized possession or3attempted possession of biological agents.

5 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, information prepared for or 6 maintained in the Biological Agents Registry shall be confidential and is not subject 7 to Title 10, Subtitle 6 of the State Government Article.

8 (b) Release of information from the Registry as authorized by regulations 9 adopted under  $\frac{17.602(c)(4)}{5.17.602(C)}$  of this subtitle shall not render the 10 information released a public record.

(C) A PERSON OR ENTITY TO WHOM SPECIFIED INFORMATION HAS BEEN
RELEASED FROM THE REGISTRY AS AUTHORIZED BY REGULATIONS ADOPTED
UNDER <u>\$ 17-602(C)(4)</u> <u>\$ 17-602(C)</u> OF THIS SUBTITLE MAY NOT RELEASE THE
INFORMATION UNLESS THE RELEASE IS APPROVED BY THE BIOLOGICAL AGENTS
REGISTRY PROGRAM.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of

17 Health and Mental Hygiene shall adopt regulations to implement § 17-602(c)(4) of

18 the Health - General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, in consultation with

19 local jurisdictions, and shall consider current standards and security measures

20 followed by local officials and emergency response agencies when obtaining

21 information about facilities within their jurisdictions that contain nuclear and

22 chemically hazardous materials.

23 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of

24 Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the Governor's Office of Homeland

25 Security, the Maryland Emergency Management Agency, the Maryland Institute for

26 Emergency Medical Services Systems, the Maryland Department of the Environment,

27 the Maryland Association of Counties, the Maryland Municipal League, and local

28 jurisdictions, shall adopt regulations to implement § 17-602(c)(5)(iii) of the Health -

29 General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, that establish procedures for

30 identifying, distributing, and maintaining the confidentiality of secure information

31 contained in the Biological Agents Registry.

32 SECTION <del>2.</del> <u>4.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 33 effect October 1, 2004.

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
