CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Biological Agents Registry Program**

- 3 FOR the purpose of providing requiring the Department of Health and Mental
- Hygiene to adopt regulations that require local jurisdictions to be informed of
- 5 the location and nature of certain biological agents in the Biological Agents
- Registry and provide for the release of certain information to certain units of 6
- government, certain police officers, and certain fire or emergency medical 7
- services entities; prohibiting disclosure of certain information to another person 8
- or entity unless authorized; defining certain terms; requiring the Department to 9
- adopt certain regulations in consultation with certain groups; clarifying the 10 definition of a certain term; and generally relating to the Biological Agents 11
- Registry Program in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. 12

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - Health - General 2 17-601. 3 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. 4 "Biological agent" means[: (b) Any select agent that is a microorganism, virus, bacterium, fungus, 5 (1) 6 rickettsia, or toxin listed in Title 42, Part 72, Appendix A of the Code of Federal Regulations; 8 Any genetically modified microorganisms or genetic elements from 9 an organism listed in Title 42, Part 72, Appendix A of the Code of Federal Regulations, 10 shown to produce or encode for a factor associated with a disease; or 11 Any genetically modified microorganisms or genetic elements that 12 contain nucleic acid sequences coding for any of the toxins listed in Title 42, Part 72, Appendix A of the Code of Federal Regulations, or their toxic submits] ANY 14 BIOLOGICAL AGENT AS DEFINED IN TITLE 42, PART 73 OF THE CODE OF FEDERAL 15 REGULATIONS, OR TITLE 9, PART 121 OF THE CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS. "MARYLAND INSTITUTE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEMS" 16 (C) MEANS THE UNIT DESCRIBED IN § 13-503 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE. 17 18 (D) "PERSON" INCLUDES STATE AND FEDERAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT. 19 [(c)] (E) "Program" means the Biological Agents Registry Program. 20 17-602. 21 There is a Biological Agents Registry Program in the Department. (a) 22 The Biological Agents Registry shall: (b) 23 Identify the biological agents possessed and maintained by any (1) person in this State; and 25 Contain other information as required by regulations adopted by the (2) 26 Department. The Department shall adopt regulations for the implementation of the 27 (c) 28 Program that: 29 (1) Determine and list the biological agents required to be reported 30 under this subtitle: 31 (2)Designate the persons required to make reports and the specific 32 information required to be reported;

32	(5) (6) Establish a system of safeguards that requires persons possessing, maintaining, and transferring biological agents subject to this subtitle to comply with the same federal standards that apply to persons registered to transfer the same agents under federal law; and
	(6) (7) Establish a process for persons that possess and maintain biological agents to alert appropriate authorities of unauthorized possession or attempted possession of biological agents.

- 2 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, information prepared for or 3 maintained in the Biological Agents Registry shall be confidential and is not subject 4 to Title 10, Subtitle 6 of the State Government Article.
- 5 (b) Release of information from the Registry as authorized by regulations 6 adopted under § 17-602(c)(4) of this subtitle shall not render the information released 7 a public record.
- 8 (C) A PERSON OR ENTITY TO WHOM SPECIFIED INFORMATION HAS BEEN
- 9 RELEASED FROM THE REGISTRY AS AUTHORIZED BY REGULATIONS ADOPTED
- 10 UNDER § 17-602(C)(4) OF THIS SUBTITLE MAY NOT RELEASE THE INFORMATION
- 11 UNLESS THE RELEASE IS APPROVED BY THE BIOLOGICAL AGENTS REGISTRY
- 12 PROGRAM.
- 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
- 14 Health and Mental Hygiene shall adopt regulations to implement § 17-602(c)(4) of
- 15 the Health General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, in consultation with
- 16 local jurisdictions, and shall consider current standards and security measures
- 17 followed by local officials and emergency response agencies when obtaining
- 18 information about facilities within their jurisdictions that contain nuclear and
- 19 chemically hazardous materials.
- 20 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
- 21 Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the Governor's Office of Homeland
- 22 Security, the Maryland Emergency Management Agency, the Maryland Institute for
- 23 Emergency Medical Services Systems, the Maryland Department of the Environment,
- 24 the Maryland Association of Counties, the Maryland Municipal League, and local
- 25 jurisdictions, shall adopt regulations to implement § 17-602(c)(5)(iii) of the Health -
- 26 General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, that establish procedures for
- 27 identifying, distributing, and maintaining the confidentiality of secure information
- 28 contained in the Biological Agents Registry.
- 29 SECTION 2: 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 30 effect October 1, 2004.
