4 5 6 7 8 9 10	FOR the purpose of prohibiting the State Board of Education from requiring certain students with disabilities seeking to obtain a high school diploma by examination to withdraw from a certain full-time school program before taking the examination; authorizing a certain student with disabilities to change the student's individualized education program to indicate that preparation for and the taking of a certain examination is part of the student's transition plan; and generally relating to students with disabilities obtaining a high school diploma by examination.

17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 22	(a) (1) An individual may obtain a high school diploma by examination as provided in this section if the individual:
23	[(1)] (I) Has not obtained a high school certificate or diploma;
	[(2)] (II) Has resided in this State or on a federal reservation in this State for at least 3 months, except that the State Board may waive this residence requirement if it considers the waiver justified;

1 [(3)](III)Is 16 years old or older; and 2 [(4)](IV) [Has] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 3 SUBSECTION, HAS withdrawn from a regular full-time public or private school 4 program for at least 3 months, except that the State Board may waive the 3-month 5 withdrawal requirement if the State Board considers the waiver justified. A STUDENT WITH A DISABILITY WHO RECEIVES SPECIAL EDUCATION 6 (2) 7 AND RELATED SERVICES SEEKING TO OBTAIN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA BY 8 EXAMINATION MAY: 9 (I) NOT BE REQUIRED TO WITHDRAW FROM A REGULAR 10 FULL-TIME PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL PROGRAM BEFORE TAKING THE 11 EXAMINATION; AND 12 CHANGE THE STUDENT'S INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION 13 PROGRAM TO INDICATE THAT PREPARATION FOR AND THE TAKING OF AN 14 EXAMINATION TO OBTAIN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IS PART OF THE STUDENT'S 15 TRANSITION PLAN. 16 The State Board shall examine individuals for a high school diploma at 17 least twice each year at places throughout this State that are reasonably convenient for the applicants. 19 The examination shall: (c) 20 (1) Be offered in appropriate high school subject areas; and 21 (2) Be of a comprehensive nature as determined by the State Board. 22 (d) An individual who fails an examination may take retests. 23 A member of the armed forces may earn the Maryland high school diploma 24 by taking the examinations furnished by the United States Armed Forces Institute and given by the appropriate service officer. The diploma shall be awarded in accordance with the rules and regulations 26 (f) 27 adopted by the State Board. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 29 July 1, 2004.
