11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 (a) Pay rates in the Standard Pay Plan may be set by:
- 16 (i) a series of pay grades and steps within each grade;
- 17 (ii) fixed rates; or
- 18 (iii) minimum and maximum amounts.
- 19 Pay rates in the Executive Pay Plan may be set by:
- 20 (i) a series of executive pay grades and steps within each grade;
- 21 (ii) fixed rates; or
- 22 (iii) minimum and maximum amounts.

- 1 (b) In setting or amending a pay rate, the Secretary shall consider: 2 (1) the prevailing pay rates for comparable services in private and public 3 employment; 4 (2) experience; 5 living costs; (3) 6 benefits; and (4)
- 8 (C) THE PAY RATE FOR A LAWYER INCLUDED IN EITHER PLAN SHALL BE 9 COMPARABLE TO THE PAY RATE FOR A LAWYER IN THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY 10 GENERAL.
