1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Economic Development Financial Assistance - Minority Business Enterprise**
3 **Procurement Goals**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring that a recipient of certain financial assistance awarded
5 under the Economic Development Opportunities Program Fund and the
6 Maryland Economic Development Assistance Authority and Fund to comply
7 with certain minority business enterprise procurement goals under certain
8 circumstances; requiring that certain minority business enterprise procurement
9 goals be included in certain financial assistance agreements; authorizing the
10 Department of Business and Economic Development to require certain
11 recipients of financial assistance to submit certain information; requiring the
12 Department to submit an annual report to a certain committee; defining certain
13 terms; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to applying
14 minority business enterprise procurement goals to financial assistance for
15 economic development awarded under the Economic Development
16 Opportunities Program Fund and the Maryland Economic Development
17 Assistance Authority and Fund.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
10 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 5-1411 of Article 83A - Business and Economic
11 Development of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s)
12 5-1412.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland
14 read as follows:

15 **Article 83A - Business and Economic Development**

16 5-1411.

17 (A) (1) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS
18 SUBTITLE THAT EXCEEDS \$100,000.

19 (2) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE USED
20 SOLELY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING REAL PROPERTY OR STRUCTURES ON
21 REAL PROPERTY.

22 (B) WITH RESPECT TO FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE TO A
23 LOCAL GOVERNMENT:

24 (1) IF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT HAS A PROGRAM FOR PROMOTING
25 PROCUREMENT OPPORTUNITIES AMONG MINORITY BUSINESSES THAT IS
26 ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SHALL APPLY THE
27 REQUIREMENTS OF THAT PROGRAM TO THE PROCUREMENT OF GOODS OR SERVICES
28 MADE WITH THE PROCEEDS FROM THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE; BUT

29 (2) IF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DOES NOT HAVE A PROGRAM THAT IS
30 ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION,
31 THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT IS SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.

32 (C) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE" ~~MEANS:~~

10 (2) WITH RESPECT TO FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE
11 TO AN ENTITY OTHER THAN A LOCAL GOVERNMENT, THE ENTITY SHALL AGREE TO
12 INCLUDE IN THE AGREEMENT PROVIDING THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE A PROVISION
13 ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT WOULD ENCOURAGE THE PROCUREMENT
14 FROM MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES OF GOODS OR SERVICES PURCHASED WITH
15 THE PROCEEDS FROM THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

16 (3) IN NEGOTIATING THE PROVISION REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2)
17 OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TAKE INTO ACCOUNT RELEVANT
18 FACTORS, INCLUDING:

19 (I) THE INTENDED USE OF THE PROCEEDS FROM THE FINANCIAL
20 ASSISTANCE; AND

21 (II) THE FEASIBILITY OF OBTAINING THE REQUIRED GOODS OR
22 SERVICES FROM MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES.

23 (D) THE DEPARTMENT MAY REQUIRE THAT A RECIPIENT OF FINANCIAL
24 ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT A LIST, OR AN
25 UPDATED LIST, OF THE MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES FROM WHICH GOODS OR
26 SERVICES WERE PROCURED AND THE NATURE AND DOLLAR AMOUNT OF THE GOODS
27 OR SERVICES.

30 (Q) (1) (I) IN THIS SUBSECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE
31 MEANINGS INDICATED.

32 (II) "FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE" MEANS A GRANT, LOAN, OR
33 INVESTMENT PROVIDED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION THAT EXCEEDS \$100,000.

34 (III) "POLITICAL SUBDIVISION" INCLUDES AN AGENCY OR OTHER
35 INSTRUMENTALITY OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION.

1 (2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE
2 USED SOLELY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING REAL PROPERTY OR STRUCTURES
3 ON REAL PROPERTY.

4 (3) WITH RESPECT TO FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS SECTION TO
5 A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION:

6 (I) IF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION HAS A PROGRAM FOR
7 PROMOTING PROCUREMENT OPPORTUNITIES AMONG MINORITY BUSINESSES THAT
8 IS ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT,
9 THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION SHALL APPLY THE REQUIREMENTS OF THAT PROGRAM
10 TO THE PROCUREMENT OF GOODS OR SERVICES MADE WITH THE PROCEEDS FROM
11 THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE; BUT

12 (II) IF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION DOES NOT HAVE A PROGRAM
13 THAT IS ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC

31 AGREE TO INCLUDE IN THE AGREEMENT PROVIDING THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE A
32 PROVISION ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC
33 DEVELOPMENT THAT WOULD ENCOURAGE THE PROCUREMENT FROM MINORITY
34 BUSINESS ENTERPRISES OF GOODS OR SERVICES PURCHASED WITH THE PROCEEDS
35 FROM THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

36 (III) IN NEGOTIATING THE PROVISION REQUIRED UNDER
37 SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND
38 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SHALL TAKE INTO ACCOUNT RELEVANT FACTORS,
39 INCLUDING:

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1. THE INTENDED USE OF THE PROCEEDS FROM THE
2 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE; AND

3 2. THE FEASIBILITY OF OBTAINING THE REQUIRED GOODS
4 OR SERVICES FROM MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES.

5 (5) THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
6 MAY REQUIRE THAT A RECIPIENT OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS SECTION
7 SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT A LIST,
8 OR AN UPDATED LIST, OF THE MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES FROM WHICH
9 GOODS OR SERVICES WERE PROCURED AND THE NATURE AND DOLLAR AMOUNT OF
10 THE GOODS OR SERVICES.

11 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
12 Business and Economic Development shall report, on or before September 1 of each
13 year, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article to the ~~Joint~~
14 ~~Committee on Fair Practices~~ Legislative Policy Committee on the results of the
15 implementation of the provisions of this Act.

16 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
17 January 1, 2005.
