2	2 Consumer Protection - Consumer Goods M	Iovers - I	Receipts

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a consumer goods mover, on completion of consumer
- 4 goods moving services, to provide a consumer with a certain written receipt;
- 5 authorizing the Attorney General to institute a civil action against any person
- 6 that violates this Act to recover for the State a certain penalty for each violation;
- 7 providing that for purposes of this Act, each prohibited failure to provide a
- 8 consumer with a certain written receipt is an independent violation; authorizing
- 9 the Attorney General to seek a certain injunction; defining certain terms;
- providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to consumer
- 11 goods movers.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 SUBTITLE 32. CONSUMER GOODS MOVERS - RECEIPTS.

- 23 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 24 INDICATED.
- 25 (B) "CONSUMER" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 13-101 OF THIS ARTICLE.

- 1 (C) "CONSUMER GOODS" MEANS GOODS USED PRIMARILY FOR PERSONAL, 2 FAMILY, OR HOUSEHOLD PURPOSES.
- 3 (D) (1) "CONSUMER GOODS MOVING SERVICES" MEANS THE LOADING,
- 4 PACKING, MOVING, TRANSPORTING, STORING WHILE IN TRANSIT, UNLOADING, OR
- 5 OTHERWISE TAKING POSSESSION OR CONTROL FROM A CONSUMER OF CONSUMER
- 6 GOODS FOR THE PURPOSE OF MOVING THEM TO ANOTHER LOCATION AT THE
- 7 DIRECTION OF THE CONSUMER FOR A FEE.
- 8 (2) "CONSUMER GOODS MOVING SERVICES" DOES NOT INCLUDE
- 9 MOVING CONSUMER GOODS FOR DISPOSAL OR DESTRUCTION.
- 10 (E) "MOVER" MEANS A PERSON WHO PROVIDES CONSUMER GOODS MOVING
- 11 SERVICES.

- 13 THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES TO A CONSUMER GOODS MOVER PROVIDING
- 14 CONSUMER GOODS MOVING SERVICES FOR AN INTRASTATE MOVE.

- 16 ON COMPLETION OF CONSUMER GOODS MOVING SERVICES FOR A CONSUMER, A
- 17 CONSUMER GOODS MOVER SHALL PROVIDE THE CONSUMER WITH A WRITTEN

- 19 (1) THE CONSUMER GOODS MOVER'S LEGAL NAME: AND
- 20 (2) THE ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF:

- 27 (A) (1) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY INSTITUTE A CIVIL ACTION AGAINST
- 28 ANY PERSON THAT VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE TO RECOVER FOR THE STATE A CIVIL
- 29 PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION.
- 30 (2) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE. EACH FAILURE TO PROVIDE A
- 31 CONSUMER WITH A WRITTEN RECEIPT THAT MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF §
- 32 14-3203 OF THIS SUBTITLE IS AN INDEPENDENT VIOLATION.
- 33 (B) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY SEEK AN INJUNCTION IN A CIVIL ACTION
- 34 TO PROHIBIT A PERSON THAT IS ENGAGED IN A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE FROM
- 35 CONTINUING TO ENGAGE IN THE VIOLATION.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2004.
