23 24 25 26 27 28	(a) No more than one license provided by this article, except by way of renewal or as otherwise provided in this section, shall be issued in any county or Baltimore City, to any person, or for the use of any partnership, corporation, unincorporated association, or limited liability company, in Baltimore City or any county of the State, and no more than one license shall be issued for the same premises except as provided in §§ 2-201 through 2-208, 2-301, and 6-701, and nothing herein shall be construed to apply to [subsections (b) and (c) of] § 7-101(B) AND (C), § 8-202(G)(2)(II) AND (III), or [to] § 12-202 [(pertaining to special music or dancing licenses for Anne Arundel County)] of this article.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
