A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Alcoholic Beverages - Closed Establishments - License Expiration

3 FOR the purpose of specifying that an alcoholic beverages license may remain

- 4 unexpired for a period not exceeding a certain time, with certain exceptions,
- 5 after the holder of the license closes the business or ceases certain operations of
- 6 the business for which the license was issued; specifying that certain
- 7 applications or a certain request may toll the period during which a license may
- 8 remain unexpired; allowing certain persons to make a written request for a
- 9 hardship extension; requiring the alcoholic beverages license issuing authority
- 10 to hold a public hearing on written requests for a hardship extension;
- 11 authorizing a license issuing authority under certain circumstances to grant a
- 12 hardship extension not exceeding a certain time; specifying certain events that
- 13 mark the beginning of the period during which a license may remain unexpired;
- specifying certain events that mark when the period may be tolled and when the
- 15 period resumes; specifying that if a certain application or request is withdrawn,
- 16 the period for an unexpired license may not be tolled; and generally relating to
- 17 expiration of alcoholic beverages licenses.

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1 (iii) A written request for a hardship extension, as provided in this 2 subsection, is filed within the 180-day period.
3 (3) The licensee or other appropriate interested parties may make a 4 written request to the Board for an extension of the life of the license due to undue 5 hardship, for a time period of no more than a cumulative period of 360 days after the 6 date of closing or cessation of alcoholic beverages business operations of the business 7 for which the license is held.

6 (ii) In Harford County, the licensee shall also submit a written 7 request to the Board at least 30 days before the anticipated date of reopening.

8 [(g)] (J) In Cecil County an alcoholic beverages license is declared null and 9 void if a licensee:

10 (1) Is no longer using the license and has the intention of terminating 11 the business of the licensed premises; and

12 (2) Has not timely filed a transfer of the license with the Board of 13 License Commissioners pursuant to § 10-503 or § 10-506 of this article.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 2004.
