- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring a contractor that is awarded a procurement contract to
- 5 use the services of any subcontractor that the contractor designates in the bid or
- 6 proposal; providing certain exceptions; defining a certain term; and generally
- 7 relating to a contractor's use of certain subcontractors in certain procurement
- 8 contracts under certain circumstances.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 16 Article State Finance and Procurement
- 17 13-227.
- 18 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "GOOD CAUSE" INCLUDES THE INABILITY OF A
- 19 SUBCONTRACTOR TO PERFORM WORK FOR A CONTRACTOR UNDER A PROCUREMENT
- 20 CONTRACT BECAUSE THE SUBCONTRACTOR:
- 21 (1) CEASES TO DO BUSINESS;
- 22 (2) LACKS THE TECHNICAL EXPERTISE OR FINANCIAL CAPABILITY TO
- 23 DO THE WORK REQUIRED BY THE CONTRACTOR TO COMPLETE THE PROCUREMENT
- 24 CONTRACT;
- 25 (3) LACKS A LICENSE TO DO THE WORK THAT IS REQUIRED UNDER THE
- 26 PROCUREMENT CONTRACT; OR

- $1 \hspace{1.5cm} \mbox{(4)} \hspace{1.5cm} \mbox{LOSES ITS LICENSE TO DO WORK IN THE STATE BECAUSE ITS 2 LICENSE IS SUSPENDED OR REVOKED.$
- 3 (B) IF A CONTRACTOR THAT IS AWARDED A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT UNDER
- 4 THIS TITLE SPECIFIES IN THE BID OR PROPOSAL THAT THE CONTRACTOR WILL USE
- 5 THE SERVICES OF A PARTICULAR SUBCONTRACTOR FOR THE PROCUREMENT
- 6 CONTRACT, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL USE THAT SUBCONTRACTOR FOR THAT
- 7 PROCUREMENT CONTRACT EXCEPT FOR GOOD CAUSE.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 9 October 1, 2004.
