Jury Duty - Exemption - Religious Beliefs

3 FOR the purpose of exempting from jury duty a person whose religious beliefs

4 prohibit the person from serving on a jury.

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

13 8-209.

14 (a) The only persons exempt from jury service are:

15 (1) A member of the organized militia who is certified by the military 16 department as a member; [and]

17 (2) A PERSON WHOSE RELIGIOUS BELIEFS PROHIBIT THE PERSON FROM 18 SERVING ON A JURY; AND

19 [(2)] (3) A person who is 70 years old or older who has made a written 20 request to the jury commissioner or clerk for an exemption.

21 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, in any 3 year period, a 22 person may not be required to:

23 (1) Serve or attend court for prospective service as a petit juror for more

- 24 than one term of court, except when necessary to complete service in a particular
- 25 case; or

- 1 (2) Serve on more than one grand jury; or
- 2 (3) Serve as both a grand and petit juror.

3 (c) As to any juror who has actually served on a petit jury for less than 5 days, 4 the 3 year limitation on frequency of jury service provided by subsection (b) of this 5 section may be reduced to not less than 1 year by appropriate provision in a juror 6 selection plan adopted under § 8-201 of this article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2004.
