- 32 (2) IF THE VEHICLE IS TRAVELING ON A HIGHWAY WITH ONLY ONE
- 33 LANE OF TRAFFIC MOVING IN THE DIRECTION THAT THE EMERGENCY VEHICLE IS
- 34 FACING AND THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT IS 35 MILES PER HOUR OR GREATER, SLOW TO
- 35 A SPEED THAT IS 20 MILES PER HOUR LESS THAN THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT.
- 36 (F) This section does not relieve the driver of an emergency vehicle from the
- 37 duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons.

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Motor Vehicle
- 2 Administration and the Department of State Police shall conduct a public education
- 3 and awareness program to inform the public of the requirements of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 5 October 1, 2004.
