	WHEREAS, Charles County, Frederick County, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County are the four Maryland counties that are closest to Washington, D.C., our nation's capital; and
26	WHEREAS, If an emergency or period of heightened alert occurs in

27 Washington, D.C., police, fire, medical, and rescue personnel as well as other "first

- 1 responders" from those four counties would be among the first on the scene to assist 2 in coping with the situation; and
- 3 WHEREAS, An emergency or period of heightened alert in Washington, D.C.,
- 4 would likely affect the residents of those four counties more directly than it would
- 5 affect the residents of other Maryland counties; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Because of their location, those four counties deserve to be 7 recognized as the "Nation's Capital First Responder Preparedness District"; and
- WHEREAS, First responders in the Nation's Capital First Responder 8
- 9 Preparedness District should receive additional resources to protect the public peace,
- 10 health, and safety, and to preserve lives and property should an emergency or period
