2 Motor Vehicles - Snow or Ice on Vehicle

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from driving or permitting to be driven on
- 4 any publicly maintained highway a vehicle with an unreasonable amount of
- 5 snow or ice on the vehicle; defining a term; specifying a penalty; making a
- 6 certain presumption regarding responsibility for certain violations applicable to
- 7 a violation of this Act; and generally relating to snow or ice on vehicles being
- 8 driven on a highway.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "UNREASONABLE AMOUNT OF SNOW OR ICE" MEANS AN
- 24 AMOUNT OF SNOW OR ICE ON ANY PART OF A VEHICLE THAT, SHOULD THE SNOW OR
- 25 ICE BECOME LOOSE OR DETACHED FROM THE VEHICLE WHILE THE VEHICLE IS
- 26 BEING DRIVEN ON A HIGHWAY, IS LIKELY TO ENDANGER OTHER USERS OF THE
- 27 HIGHWAY.

- 1 (B) A PERSON MAY NOT DRIVE OR ALLOW TO BE DRIVEN ON ANY PUBLICLY
- 2 MAINTAINED HIGHWAY A VEHICLE WITH AN UNREASONABLE AMOUNT OF SNOW OR
- 3 ICE ON THE VEHICLE..

- The owner of the vehicle, if present in the vehicle, or, in his absence, the driver
- 6 of the vehicle is presumed to be responsible for any violation of §§ 24-106 through
- 7 [24-106.2] 24-106.3 of this title, if:
- 8 (1) The violation is caused by an occupant of the vehicle;
- 9 (2) The vehicle has two or more occupants; and
- 10 (3) It cannot be determined which occupant is the violator.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 12 October 1, 2004.
