

2 Access to Quality in Higher Education Act of 2004

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor to include in the annual budget
- 4 submission for a certain fiscal year a certain amount of general fund State
- support for public senior higher education institutions; requiring the Governor
- 6 to include in the annual budget submission for certain fiscal years for public
- 7 senior higher education institutions an increase in the amount of general fund
- 8 State support of a certain percentage per certain full-time equivalent resident
- 9 student; requiring certain appropriations in a certain fiscal year be made to
- certain public senior higher education institutions under certain circumstances;
- providing that certain funding may not supplant certain funding to certain
- public senior higher education institutions; requiring the Board of Regents of
- the University System of Maryland to submit a biannual report beginning on a
- 14 certain date regarding certain policies and procedures; prohibiting certain
- 15 governing boards of public senior higher education institutions from
- implementing a tuition rate for a certain academic year greater than a certain
- amount; limiting, to no more than a certain percent for certain academic years,
- the amount of the annual increase in tuition that may be charged each academic

- 2 ACADEMIC YEAR BEGINNING IN THE FALL OF 2005 AND EACH ACADEMIC YEAR
- 3 THROUGH THE FALL OF 2014, A GOVERNING BOARD MAY NOT APPROVE, AND A
- 4 PUBLIC SENIOR HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION MAY NOT IMPOSE, AN INCREASE
- 5 IN THE TUITION CHARGED FOR AN ACADEMIC YEAR TO A RESIDENT

- 7 THE AMOUNT CHARGED FOR TUITION AT THE INSTITUTION THE PRECEDING

- 9 (2) THE TUITION LIMITATION IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION
- 10 ONLY APPLIES IF THE GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC SENIOR HIGHER
- 11 EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS IN THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR HAS INCREASED AT
- 12 LEAST 5 PERCENT OVER THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR
- 13 PURSUANT TO § 11-105(I)(6) OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 15 General Assembly to move the sum of the State General Fund appropriation and
- 16 tuition for University System Institutions, on a per student basis, to at least the
- 17 average of their peer institutions as determined by the Maryland Higher Education
- 18 Commission, in order to be consistent with Chapter 246 of the Acts of 1988, which
- 19 formed the University System of Maryland, and with Chapter 515 of 1999, also
- 20 known as the Larson Commission.
- 21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 22 General Assembly that the State should set a goal of 90% of the funding guidelines to
- 23 be continued beyond 2013 in order to maintain the level of investment needed for
- 24 quality and to hold spending below the average of comparable universities to
- 25 encourage efficiency.
- 26 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 27 General Assembly to continue to support Maryland's historically black institutions in
- 28 accordance with the agreement reached between the State of Maryland and the
- 29 United States Department of Education, Office of Civil Rights in December 2000.
- 30 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 31 July 1, 2004.
