(d) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Department of 3 Legislative Services shall provide staff for the Task Force.

4 (e) A member of the Task Force:

6 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 7 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

8 (f) The Task Force shall:

9 (1) study the impact of illegal immigrants on health care providers in the 10 State;

11 (2) study the effect of illegal immigrants on the cost of health care in the 12 State;

13 (3) ascertain the amount and cost of services that health care 14 practitioners and institutions provide to illegal immigrants; and

15 (4) make recommendations regarding legislation to address problems16 documented by the Task Force.

17 (g) The Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the

18 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the

19 General Assembly, on or before December 1, 2004.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take

21 effect July 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of

22 December 31, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act

23 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
