14 15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:
16 17	(a) There is a Task Force to Study the Financial Impact of Illegal Immigrants on Maryland's Job Market.
18	(b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
19 20	(1) five members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;
21 22	(2) five members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
23 24	(3) the Secretary of Business and Economic Development, or the Secretary's designee;
25 26	(4) five members, appointed by the Governor, who are experts in the field of immigration law or employment; and
27	(5) five consumer members, appointed by the Governor.

- 1 (c) The Governor shall designate the chairman of the Task Force.
- 2 (d) The Department of Business and Economic Development and the
- 3 Department of Legislative Services shall provide staff for the Task Force.
- 4 (e) A member of the Task Force:
- 5 (1) may not receive compensation; but
- 6 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 7 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- 8 (f) The Task Force shall:
- 9 (1) study the impact of illegal immigrants on the job market in the State;
- 10 (2) determine which job categories, industries, or businesses have
- 11 significant numbers of illegal immigrant workers;
- 12 (3) assess the effect of employment of illegal immigrants on the
- 13 competitive bidding process;
- 14 (4) ascertain the number of jobs in which illegal immigrants unfairly
- 15 replace citizens; and
- 16 (5) make recommendations regarding legislation to address problems
- 17 documented by the Task Force.
- 18 (g) The Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the
- 19 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the
- 20 General Assembly, on or before December 1, 2004.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 July 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of
- 23 December 31, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
- 24 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
