2	Injury to or Death of Domesticated Dog or Cat - Compensatory and Punitive
3	Damages

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing that a person who negligently injures or causes the
- 5 death of a pet that is a domesticated dog or cat while acting individually or
- 6 through an animal under the person's direction or control shall be liable to the
- 7 owner of the pet for certain compensatory damages not exceeding a certain
- 8 amount; establishing that a person who intentionally injures or causes the
- 9 death of a pet that is a domesticated dog or cat while acting individually or
- through an animal under the person's direction or control shall be liable to the
- owner of the pet for certain compensatory damages; repealing certain provisions
- relating to the recovery of certain damages for the tortious injury or death of a
- pet that is not a domesticated dog or cat; providing certain exceptions to
- liability; establishing that a person who intentionally and with actual malice
- injures or causes the death of a pet that is a domesticated dog or cat while acting
- individually or through an animal under the person's direction or control shall
- be liable to the owner of the pet for certain compensatory and punitive damages;
- defining a certain term; altering a certain definition; providing that this Act
- does not apply to certain customary and normal practices of a person licensed by
- 20 the State to provide veterinary care; providing for the application of this Act;
- and generally relating to civil liability for injuring or causing the death of a pet

- 28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 29 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

- 3 (a) (1) In this section[, "pet"] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 4 MEANINGS INDICATED.
- 5 "COMPENSATORY DAMAGES" MEANS:
- 6 (I) IN THE CASE OF THE DEATH OF A PET, THE FAIR MARKET
- 7 VALUE OF THE PET BEFORE DEATH AND THE REASONABLE AND NECESSARY COST OF
- 8 VETERINARY CARE; AND
- 9 (II) IN THE CASE OF AN INJURY TO A PET, THE REASONABLE AND
- 10 NECESSARY COST OF VETERINARY CARE.
- 11 (3) "PET" means a domesticated [animal] DOG OR CAT UNDER THE
- 12 CONTROL OF ITS OWNER OR ITS OWNER'S AGENT.
- 13 [(2) "Pet" does not include livestock.]
- 14 (b) (1) [The measure of damages for tortious injuries to or death of a pet is
- 15 the market value of the pet before the injury or death or the reasonable cost of
- 16 veterinary care, but not more than \$5,000 if such charge is greater] A PERSON WHO
- 17 NEGLIGENTLY INJURES OR CAUSES THE DEATH OF A PET WHILE ACTING
- 18 INDIVIDUALLY OR THROUGH AN ANIMAL UNDER THE PERSON'S DIRECTION OR
- 19 CONTROL IS LIABLE TO THE OWNER OF THE PET FOR COMPENSATORY DAMAGES.
- 20 (2) THE DAMAGES AWARDED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
- 21 SUBSECTION MAY NOT EXCEED \$5,000.
- 22 (C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A
- 23 PERSON WHO INTENTIONALLY INJURES OR CAUSES THE DEATH OF A PET WHILE
- 24 ACTING INDIVIDUALLY OR THROUGH AN ANIMAL UNDER THE PERSON'S DIRECTION
- 25 OR CONTROL IS LIABLE TO THE OWNER OF THE PET FOR COMPENSATORY DAMAGES.
- 26 (2) A PERSON WHO INTENTIONALLY INJURES OR CAUSES THE DEATH OF
- 27 A PET WHILE ACTING IN SELF DEFENSE, DEFENSE OF ANOTHER, DEFENSE OF A PET,
- 28 OR DEFENSE OF ONE'S PROPERTY IS NOT LIABLE TO THE OWNER OF THE PET UNDER
- 29 THIS SUBSECTION.
- 30 (D) A PERSON WHO INTENTIONALLY AND WITH ACTUAL MALICE INJURES OR
- 31 CAUSES THE DEATH OF A PET WHILE ACTING INDIVIDUALLY OR THROUGH AN
- 32 ANIMAL UNDER THE PERSON'S DIRECTION OR CONTROL IS LIABLE TO THE OWNER
- 33 OF THE PET FOR COMPENSATORY AND PUNITIVE DAMAGES.
- 34 (E) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE CUSTOMARY AND NORMAL
- 35 PRACTICES OF A PERSON LICENSED BY THE STATE TO PROVIDE VETERINARY CARE.

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
- 2 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have
- 3 any effect on or application to any cause of action that arises before the effective date
- 4 of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 6 effect October 1, 2004.
