That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 9 **Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings** 10 11-110. 11 (a) (1) In this section[, "pet"] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 12 MEANINGS INDICATED. 13 (2) "COMPENSATORY DAMAGES" MEANS: 14 IN THE CASE OF THE DEATH OF A PET, THE FAIR MARKET (I) 15 VALUE OF THE PET BEFORE DEATH AND THE REASONABLE AND NECESSARY COST OF 16 VETERINARY CARE; AND 17 (II)IN THE CASE OF AN INJURY TO A PET, THE REASONABLE AND 18 NECESSARY COST OF VETERINARY CARE. 19 (3) "PET" means a domesticated [animal] DOG OR CAT UNDER THE <u>(I)</u> 20 CONTROL OF ITS OWNER OR ITS OWNER'S AGENT. 21 $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$ (II)"Pet" does not include livestock. 22 [The measure of damages for tortious injuries to or death of a pet is (1) 23 the market value of the pet before the injury or death or the reasonable cost of 24 veterinary care, but not more than \$5,000 if such charge is greater] A PERSON WHO 25 NEGLIGENTLY INJURES OR CAUSES THE DEATH TORTIOUSLY CAUSES AN INJURY TO 26 OR DEATH OF A PET WHILE ACTING INDIVIDUALLY OR THROUGH AN ANIMAL UNDER 27 THE PERSON'S DIRECTION OR CONTROL IS LIABLE TO THE OWNER OF THE PET FOR 28 COMPENSATORY DAMAGES. THE DAMAGES AWARDED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 29 30 SUBSECTION MAY NOT EXCEED \$5,000 \$10,000. 31 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION. A 32 PERSON WHO INTENTIONALLY INJURES OR CAUSES THE DEATH OF A PET WHILE 33 ACTING INDIVIDUALLY OR THROUGH AN ANIMAL UNDER THE PERSON'S DIRECTION 34 OR CONTROL IS LIABLE TO THE OWNER OF THE PET FOR COMPENSATORY DAMAGES.

- 1 (2) A PERSON WHO INTENTIONALLY INJURES OR CAUSES THE DEATH OF
- 2 A PET WHILE ACTING IN SELF DEFENSE, DEFENSE OF ANOTHER, DEFENSE OF A PET,
- 3 OR DEFENSE OF ONE'S PROPERTY IS NOT LIABLE TO THE OWNER OF THE PET UNDER
- 4 THIS SUBSECTION.
- 5 (D) A PERSON WHO INTENTIONALLY AND WITH ACTUAL MALICE INJURES OR
- 6 CAUSES THE DEATH OF A PET WHILE ACTING INDIVIDUALLY OR THROUGH AN
- 7 ANIMAL UNDER THE PERSON'S DIRECTION OR CONTROL IS LIABLE TO THE OWNER
- 8 OF THE PET FOR COMPENSATORY AND PUNITIVE DAMAGES.
- 9 (E) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE CUSTOMARY AND NORMAL
- 10 PRACTICES OF A PERSON LICENSED BY THE STATE TO PROVIDE VETERINARY CARE.
- 11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
- 12 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have
- 13 any effect on or application to any cause of action that arises before the effective date
- 14 of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 16 effect October 1, 2004.
