# 2 Vehicle Laws - Distracted Driving

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a driver of a motor vehicle that is in motion from
- 4 being distracted by engaging in certain activities; providing that a driver may
- 5 use a mobile telephone or electronic device under certain circumstances;
- 6 establishing that a certain violation is not a moving violation for the purpose of
- 7 assessing points; requiring a law enforcement officer who makes a certain report
- 8 to include certain information; requiring certain reports to be provided to the
- 9 Motor Vehicle Administration; requiring the Administration to make a certain
- report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year;
- authorizing a judge to waive a certain penalty under certain circumstances;
- defining certain terms; requiring the Administration to provide information
- about distracted driving to certain drivers and to include questions about
- distracted driving on the driver's license exam; and generally relating to

- 26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 27 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### 1 **Article - Transportation** 2 21-1123. IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 3 (A) (1) 4 INDICATED. "DISTRACTED" MEANS ENGAGING IN ACTIVITIES THAT CAUSE THE 5 (2) 6 DRIVER TO BE INATTENTIVE WHILE OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE AND THAT 7 RESULT IN THE UNSAFE OPERATION OF THE VEHICLE INCLUDING: 8 (I) **READING:** 9 (II)WRITING: 10 (III)PERFORMING PERSONAL GROOMING; (IV) INTERACTING WITH PETS OR OTHER UNSECURED CARGO; OR 11 12 USING A MOBILE TELEPHONE OR OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICE. (V) "ELECTRONIC DEVICE" INCLUDES COMPUTERS, PAGERS, AND VIDEO 13 (3) 14 GAMES. "HANDS-FREE ACCESSORY" MEANS AN ATTACHMENT TO OR 15 (4) 16 BUILT-IN FEATURE OF A MOBILE TELEPHONE THAT ALLOWS A DRIVER TO MAINTAIN 17 BOTH HANDS ON THE STEERING WHEEL WHILE USING THE MOBILE TELEPHONE. "MOBILE TELEPHONE" MEANS A CELLULAR, ANALOG, WIRELESS, OR 18 19 DIGITAL TELEPHONE CAPABLE OF SENDING OR RECEIVING TELEPHONE MESSAGES 20 WITHOUT AN ACCESS LINE FOR SERVICE. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION. A DRIVER OF 21 22 A MOTOR VEHICLE THAT IS IN MOTION MAY NOT BE DISTRACTED. 23 (C) A DRIVER MAY USE A MOBILE TELEPHONE OR ELECTRONIC DEVICE IF: EXCEPT FOR A DRIVER HOLDING A LEARNER'S INSTRUCTIONAL 25 PERMIT OR THE DRIVER OF A SCHOOL BUS CARRYING PASSENGERS, THE MOBILE 26 TELEPHONE OR ELECTRONIC DEVICE IS EQUIPPED WITH A HANDS-FREE 27 ACCESSORY; THE MOBILE TELEPHONE OR ELECTRONIC DEVICE IS BEING USED 28 29 TO CALL A 9-1-1 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM OR A PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCY IN 30 CONNECTION WITH AN EMERGENCY: THE MOBILE TELEPHONE OR ELECTRONIC DEVICE IS BEING USED 31 (3)32 BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, EMERGENCY PERSONNEL, OR THE DRIVER OF AN 33 AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE ACTING WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE PERSON'S

- 1 (4) THE USE IS LIMITED TO TURNING THE MOBILE TELEPHONE OR 2 ELECTRONIC DEVICE ON OR OFF.
- 3 (D) A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION IS NOT A MOVING VIOLATION FOR THE 4 PURPOSE OF ASSESSING POINTS UNDER § 16-402 OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 5 (E) A JUDGE MAY WAIVE A PENALTY IMPOSED FOR A FIRST VIOLATION OF
- 6 THIS SECTION INVOLVING A MOBILE TELEPHONE OR AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE IF,
- 7 PRIOR TO THE HEARING DATE, THE DRIVER:
- 8 (1) ACQUIRES A HANDS-FREE ACCESSORY; AND
- 9 (2) PROVIDES PROOF OF THE ACQUISITION TO THE COURT.
- 10 (F) (1) A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHO MAKES A WRITTEN REPORT OF
- 11 AN ACCIDENT INVOLVING A MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL INCLUDE IN THE REPORT THE
- 12 FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 13 (I) WHETHER A MOBILE TELEPHONE OR OTHER ELECTRONIC
- 14 DEVICE WAS PRESENT IN THE MOTOR VEHICLE AT THE TIME OF THE ACCIDENT;
- 15 (II) WHETHER THE USE OF A MOBILE TELEPHONE OR OTHER
- 16 ELECTRONIC DEVICE MAY HAVE CONTRIBUTED TO THE CAUSE OF THE ACCIDENT;
- 17 AND
- 18 (III) WHETHER THE DRIVER BEING DISTRACTED MAY HAVE
- 19 CONTRIBUTED TO THE CAUSE OF THE ACCIDENT.
- 20 (2) THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL PROVIDE TO THE
- 21 ADMINISTRATION A COPY OF EACH ACCIDENT REPORT INDICATING THAT THE
- 22 DRIVER BEING DISTRACTED CONTRIBUTED TO THE ACCIDENT.
- 23 (G) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 OF EACH YEAR, THE ADMINISTRATION
- 24 SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE
- 25 STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE INFORMATION PROVIDED UNDER
- 26 SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION AND THE POSSIBLE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN
- 27 MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS IN THE STATE AND VIOLATIONS OF THIS SECTION.

- 29 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the
- 30 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:
- 31 (1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any
- 32 other law of this State; or
- 33 (2) Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the
- 34 Maryland Vehicle Law.

- 1 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 2 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 3 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Motor Vehicle
- 5 Administration shall:
- 6 (1) provide educational information on distracted driving to drivers 7 obtaining learner's permits; and
- 8 (2) include questions pertaining to distracted driving on the driver's 9 license exam.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 11 effect October 1, 2004.
